ANALYSIS

This bill limits immunization requirements to those diseases identified in statute and removes the department of health and human service's rulemaking authority in this area.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 Communicable Disease; Immunization. Amend RSA 141-C:20-a, I to read as follows:
- I. All parents or legal guardians shall have their children who are residing in this state immunized against [eertain diseases. These diseases shall include, but not be limited to,] diphtheria, mumps, pertussis, poliomyelitis, rubella, rubeola, and tetanus. [The commissioner shall adopt rules under RSA 541-A relative to other diseases which require immunization.]
- 6 2 Repeal. RSA 141-C:6, XIII, relative to rulemaking for other communicable diseases under 7 RSA 141-C:20-a, I.
 - 3 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
