WITH TWO WEEKS TO GO, BOLDUC MAINTAINS LEAD IN NH GOP SENATE PRIMARY

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
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DURHAM, NH - Retired Brigadier General Don Bolduc leads NH Senate President Chuck Morse in the race for the 2022 Republican nomination to the U.S. Senate, with other candidates far behind. Among those who remain undecided, four in ten say an endorsement by former President Donald Trump would make them more likely to support that candidate but about one-third say a Trump endorsement would make them less likely to vote for that candidate. Bolduc and Morse are much better known and more popular among likely Republican primary voters than other Senate candidates.

2022 NH Republican Senatorial Primary

With two weeks remaining until the September 13th New Hampshire primary elections, retired Brigadier General Don Bolduc continues to lead his fellow Republican candidates. If the 2022 Republican primary election for U.S. Senate was being held today, 43% of likely Republican primary voters would vote for Bolduc, 22% would vote for NH Senate President Chuck Morse, 5% each would vote for entrepreneur Vikram Mansharamani or for entrepreneur Bruce Fenton, 3% would vote for former Londonderry Town Manager Kevin Smith, and 2% would vote for another candidate. However, 20% say that they are undecided.

Bolduc holds a significant lead among likely Republican primary voters aged 35 to 49 and those aged 65 and older, but he and Morse are closely divided among those aged 18 to 34. Bolduc holds a wide lead among conservative radio listeners and *The Joe Rogan Experience* listeners but holds a slightly smaller lead over Morse among Fox News viewers.


Donald Trump's endorsement has been seen as critical to the success of many Republican candidates across the country this year, but neither he nor NH Governor Chris Sununu have endorsed a candidate in the 2022 NH Republican U.S. Senate primary. In NH, Sununu and Trump's potential endorsements would be helpful for the same percentage of primary voters, but Trump's endorsement turns off more voters than does Sununu's.

Thirty-five percent of NH Republican primary voters say that Sununu endorsing a candidate would make them more likely to vote for that candidate, half (50%) say it would have no effect on their vote, 9% say it would make them less likely to vote for that candidate, and 5% are unsure. Thirty-six percent say that Trump endorsing a candidate would make them more likely to vote for that candidate, 44% say it would have no effect on their vote, 19% say it would make them less likely to vote for that candidate, and 1% are unsure.


Effect of Possible Sununu & Trump Endorsements - August 2022

Among likely Republican primary voters who are still undecided on their preferred candidate for U.S. Senate (N=178), only 21% say a Sununu endorsement would make them more likely to vote for that candidate, while most say a Sununu endorsement would have no effect or they are unsure what effect it would have. By contrast, 41% say that a Trump endorsement would make them more likely to support that candidate, but 36% say that they would be less likely to support a candidate endorsed by Trump.




Effect of Possible Sununu & Trump Endorsements - Among Undecided GOP Senate Republican Primary Voters - August 2022

Bolduc and Morse are the best known Republican candidates for U.S. Senate among likely Republican primary voters; 89% know enough to have an opinion about Bolduc and 78% have an opinion about Morse. Far fewer likely Republican primary voters have an opinion on Fenton (63%), Mansharamani (52%), or Smith (50%). Bolduc is also the most popular among likely Republican primary voters, enjoying a net favorability rating (the percentage who have a favorable opinion minus the percentage with an unfavorable opinion) of +42, followed by Morse with a net favorability rating of +30. Mansharamani has a net favorability rating of +0, Smith has a net favorability of -2, and Fenton has a net favorability rating of -5.




Four in five (80%) likely Republican primary voters say that they are very interested in the 2022 NH primary, 19% are somewhat interested, 1% are not very interested, and none say that they are not at all interested. Likely Republican primary voters aged 65 and older and those with a household income below \$45,000 are more likely than others to say that they are very interested.





Just over half (54%) of likely Republican primary voters say that they have paid a lot of attention to the 2022 NH primary, 39% say they have paid some attention, 6% say they have paid only a little attention, less than 1% say they have not paid any attention, and 1% are unsure. Likely Republican primary voters aged 65 and older and Fox News viewers are more likely than others to say that they have paid a lot of attention to the primary.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. One thousand, nine hundred and ninety-three (1,993) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between August 25 and August 29, 2022. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/-2.2 percent. Included in the sample were 892 likely 2022 Republican primary voters (MSE = +/-3.3%). These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the August 2022 Granite State Poll is 26%. The design effect for the survey is 2.9%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 7,500 New Hampshire adults have been recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
