One of the most infamous examples is the Charlottesville lie – that Trump called people waving Nazi flags "very good people":





Liberalism Is A Mental Disorder

There are those who have observed that there seems to be a correlation between mental illness and liberalism; e.g., **Does Liberalism Cause Mental Illness?**. Before we jump to conclusions that it may be the other way around let me observe I could argue both directions.

Consider the Frantz Fanon quote from Part 1 about cognitive dissonance (requoted here for your convenience):

"Sometimes people hold a core belief that is very strong. When they are presented with evidence that works against that belief, the new evidence cannot be accepted. It would create a feeling that is extremely uncomfortable, called cognitive dissonance. And because it is so important to protect the core belief, they will rationalize, ignore and even deny anything that doesn't fit in with the core belief."

Having to constantly defend one's mind against inconvenient information is *wearing*. Shards and splinters of dreaded reality are bound to get through, even if not consciously recognized, and those can needle at a person causing mental illness. For example, consider the many abortion workers who take the job thinking they are helping women get rid of "clumps of cells"... only to start seeing arms, legs, etc., being removed from the women whose "clump of cells" they helped terminate.

One can only DENY for so long before, even if the reality is still buried and lurking in the subconscious, it starts to traumatize. So to assist in this defense they have developed the habit of snap-rejection of anything from outside their approved circles and self-esteem-

pumping emotional beliefs. Hence why it is so hard to talk with them about – well – anything.

AN ATTEMPT TO SUMMARIZE

Better men and women than I have agonized over the mentality of the average Leftist and still not truly explained it. But as I pointed out to the author of that Leftists-are-cultists series (see part 1) and discussed with someone else just recently, I think there are some intertwined elements that we can use as at least a partial window.

First, we see a cocksure arrogance; it's one thing to be confident, but their surety of correctness goes far, far beyond that. If there's one thing that's driven my evolution it's been an intellectual curiosity and a willingness to admit I may not know everything, and might even be wrong (I thought I was wrong once, but I was mistaken). In other words, channeling Francis Porretto of **Bastion of Liberty**, we have *humility* (one of the **Seven Cardinal Virtues**).



I was absolutely sure of my positions... until some sliver of data came in under my shields and caused me to think "That's weird..." Faced with a dissonance between what I "knew" was true and something that differed, no matter how small, I was willing to investigate. In other words, channeling Oliver Cromwell, I was willing to consider I might be mistaken.



On the Left, however, is an overweening pride in believing they are correct; that correctness is reinforced by their Collective, which leads to a second thing: r/K mentality.

Conservatives, being K-selected – see this excellent book, The Evolutionary Psychology

Behind Politics: How Conservatism and Liberalism Evolved Within Humans, Third

Edition – are willing to stand apart from the herd and stand our ground. We seek ABSOLUTE

TRUTH, testable truth. Not out of obstinance or raw stubbornness, but out of conviction and a

desire to be where the truth is.

Liberals, leaning towards r-selection, lean towards SOCIAL/RELATIVE TRUTH – i.e., the truth of the herd.

Why the difference? Change is hard, and it can be very hard. It can be very uncomfortable and difficult to admit that something you believed – especially something that made you believe you are a good person – is wrong. Heralding back to Sowell's conflict of visions, changing that fundamental assumption of how you view the world can wrack a person enormously. It's akin to people in therapy tending to shy away, get defensive, and even quit therapy as they're getting close to a revelation they really don't want to have coming to conscious recognition. (Not TMI, I think, but my wife was in therapy for a while and making progress. Some of the things she's told me about her childhood would blister paint – *yikes!* – but she was starting to get close to some serious revelations that her after-action conversations about her sessions hinted at… and she *quit*, saying "I'm not getting anything from this". Perfect example.)

It's far easier – SLOTH being another **deadly sin** – to stay with the herd, be praised for being in the herd and aligning with it, then to stand on one's own to test and determine the truth against reality. Doing so can cost friends, it can cost relationships with family; **The Shunning**. It can cost you your job. That's a hard path to choose.

And lastly, as I pointed out in **Civilizational Collapse and the Brain**, I believe there are fundamental brain-structure elements in why civilizations collapse. Could there be a dopamine sensitivity aspect as well? We get dopamine-hit pleasure from group support and praise. Those who are more sensitive to dopamine could well be more susceptible to being praised, and thus more likely to stay in the group that praises, rather than standing on one's own. And for rising societies where people increasingly congregate, higher dopamine sensitivity and thus conformance to the group could well be survival traits to work together and cooperate... until they become liabilities.

I know of no studies being done to test this. I wonder... Is there a correlation between neural dopamine sensitivity and political position?

One other factor: as I wrote in **Hardwired for Faith**, which aligns with that recent conversation with someone where we talked about the self-centeredness of today's society, including the ubiquitous selfie – a proxy for self-worship (image and link in original):


We have people who have come to worship themselves, whether consciously or not; consider the speed with which selfies – approaching the very definition of narcissistic admiration – have taken root in popular culture (and feeding off the sin of VANITY). We also have vanity fed by how many likes and comments we get on social media posts.

If we change "inflated sense of self" into "belief in their own divinity" and "likesand-shares metrics by others" into "prayers and supplications from worshippers" - easy substitutions IMHO - we see that they've indeed lifted themselves to demi-god status - even if not consciously-recognized.

Our "intellectual and moral elites" very often are not just non-believers, but openly hostile to the idea of a supreme being. They have become, in their eyes, gods – and are the "other gods" Hashem warned us about in the First Commandment.

The Leftist Sense of Self (all formatting and links in the original – not going to italicize because I'm lazy):

In the days when I debated in the local paper's comment section I was one of the few regularly-posting people from the Right. One day a Leftist sneeringly replied to one of my comments "Do you realize nobody ever 'likes' your comments?" My reply was something to the effect of "I didn't realize we were in a high school popularity contest."

But that got me thinking that Leftists are herd-beasts (I started keeping track – all the good little Leftists would *like-swarm* each others' comments). They move together. They think together. They studiously avoid thoughts that are not of The Collective. A former co-worker was, one day, ranting about eeeeevil Conservative attacks on Planned Parenthood; he then commented "I don't know anyone who is against abortion." I raised my hand, and he sneered and dismissed me outright. That reprises the apocryphal quote "I can't believe Nixon won. I don't know anyone who voted for him."

Liberals are constantly checking their views against those of their fellows because, deep down, they're not sure of their own. I think that it's one reason they slide to further and further extremes. It also simply explains, as in *Occam's Razor*, why they can turn on each other so readily when one strays off the reservation. But consider this essay, which makes me think that these people actually get a high off the rush of approvals by their fellow liberals. So what happens with drug addicts? They constantly have to increase the dose. So, liberals constantly go further and further in being SJWs to exceed the last person who got adulation.

Ultimately, for the Leftist, it's not about what they think, it's about what others think about them. Read this essay by a psychologist whose work and essays I really like; alas, she's gone dark after Obama's re-election. And then READ IT AGAIN – it's that good. They're not strong enough to stand on their own convictions.

On LinkedIn, the only SM platform I am on, Leftists post and then other Leftists Like and comment to support and me-too the original. Whether it's on **Russia-Russia-Russia** or

anything else they gin each other up. And, especially, whenever a Conservative (or really anyone sane) posts a rejoinder they swarm in to counter it.

Not that Conservatives don't do this too, I need to add, but it's obsessive with the Left. They cannot - CANNOT - let a Conservative have the last word and will worry at a thread's bone long after the Conservatives have given up.

It's like antibodies swarming an invader! And I think that's apt, and fits in well with my comment about conceptual splinters (above). And while I'm not qualified to make diagnoses, certainly not remotely, I think this quote from **Narcissistic Personality Disorder: Top Five Symptoms** fits quite well, don't you?

Narcissistic Personality Disorder (NPD) is a highly pervasive psychological disorder characterized mainly by self-centeredness. Narcissistic Personality Disorder symptoms include a complete and total lack of empathy, along with a highly-exaggerated sense of self-importance. Personality disorder treatment is very important. Like other personality disorders, NPD is extremely harmful when it becomes a persistent pattern of behavior over time, if left untreated and undiagnosed. Narcissistic Personality Disorder symptoms have far-reaching negative consequences. They adversely affect a patient's life, including their social, family, and work relationships.

Signs of Narcissistic Personality Disorder include an abnormal and constant need for affirmation, attention, and praise. These patients have long-lasting fantasies about attaining power and success. Narcissistic Personality Disorder (NPD) may even result in a person exploiting other people for personal gain. They do not have any sympathy or compassion for others.

Personality disorder treatment addresses the problem of an exaggerated sense of one's own achievements and abilities. These patients feel they are the "chosen ones." Expecting special treatment is also not uncommon with NPD patients. Narcissism, as a personality trait, is well-studied and researched; it is a term commonly employed to describe people who are more concerned and interested with themselves than other people around them.

Personality disorder treatment distinguishes between those who exhibit


signs of narcissistic personality disorder and those who by their very nature are arrogant, confident, and self-centered. The latter may not suffer from Narcissistic Personality Disorder, or NPD, as they do not have the over-exaggerated or grandiose view of their own abilities and skills, which are the principal signs of narcissistic personality disorder.

Narcissistic personality disorder is confirmed only if a person exhibits five or more of the following symptoms:

- 1. They have an exaggerated view of their achievements and talents; there is absolutely no limit to their sense of self-importance.
- 2. They are constantly preoccupied with fantasies of beauty, ideal love, power, brilliance, and even unlimited success.
- 3. They think and believe that they alone are special and unique, and that they must be given an opportunity to interact with people of high-status and special institutions.
- 4. They always expect, and in fact need, constant and excessive admiration.
- 5. One of the most obvious signs of narcissistic personality disorder is deep-rooted chronic envy. This manifests itself in an overtly-arrogant and haughty attitude.


I think it fits quite well indeed. Which also meshes well with the whole Liberal – Mental Illness correlation.
