Moderators are required to submit this Post-Election Certificate to their town or ward clerks within 48 hours of the closing of the polls (RSA 659:73). Completing this record on election night as part of reconciliation will help ensure the results you announce are accurate. It is the moderator's job to ensure that votes are accurately counted (RSA 659:60). The Secretary of State's office requests that a copy of this completed Post-Election Certificate be sent to our office with the Return of Votes form on election night.

Part I - Reconciliation

Compare the Sum of all Votes, and the Voter Participation/Voters Checking-In, to the Ballots Cast (from A, B, and C in PART II)

These three numbers below should all be equivalent. Differences may indicate a tallying error. Consider the size of any difference in light of the closest outcome, race, or question. Either do further work to resolve/reduce differences or finalize the results knowing the differences exist. Announce the differences when announcing the results. This allows those considering requesting a recount to know about what differences exist.

A SUM OF ALL VOTES*

Pick two races and one question in which the most voters typically vote. For each race/question, add the number of votes, plus the number of write-in votes, plus the number of undervotes, plus the number of overvotes. The sum of all votes for each "vote for not more than 1" race/question should be equivalent. Significant differences may indicate a tallying error and further work is needed. Enter the sum of all votes for one of the races selected in the box to the right.
